Earlier this year, the Wisconsin Legislature adopted and the Governor signed a bold new law declaring "the express policy of the state to mobilize governmental effort and resources at all levels, state, federal, and local" for "the enhancement of the quality management and protection of all waters of the state, ground and surface, public and private."

There is administrative as well as legislative determination that Wisconsin have a water management program in which it can take great pride. A substantial increase in personnel has been authorized. Many of these positions are to be filled now; others are expected to be filled on July 1, 1967. Applications may be made now both for the positions currently available and for the positions to be filled in July.

Most of the positions are in engineering and scientific professions but there are a number of administrative positions open as well.

If you would like to be associated with this challenging, exciting program--one that will require imagination, initiative and dedication, if you want to be a part of a hard-working, top-notch team that is determined to set a pattern other states can follow, the Water Resources Division of the Wisconsin Department of Resource Development would like to hear from you.

The water resource program will be concerned with the uses of streams, rivers and lakes, with the adequacy of public and private water supplies, and with sewage treatment. It will involve state-local, interstate, and federal-state action. The University of Wisconsin and other institutions of higher education have pledged their interest in and assistance to the program.

Five management regions have been established, opening positions in Eau Claire, Green Bay, Milwaukee, Rhinelander and Wisconsin Rapids, as well as Madison.

General information about the Wisconsin state personnel program, specific information about the positions to be filled, and an application blank are included in this folder.
